Think of it as a 1:1 student:computer ratio, without needing 1:1 physical devices. This presentation will examine the educational case for Desktop Virtualisation and provide a non-technical overview of how it works, the key components and the factors to consider before embarking on a project. The presentation will also provide real-world warts-and-all experiences from two trailblazing projects being managed by Atkins.


